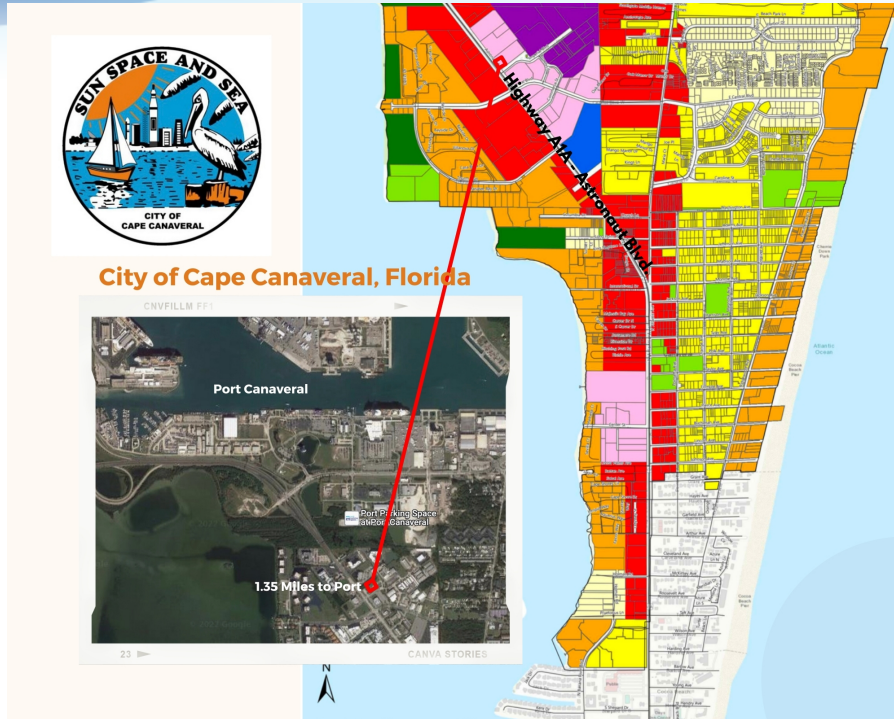

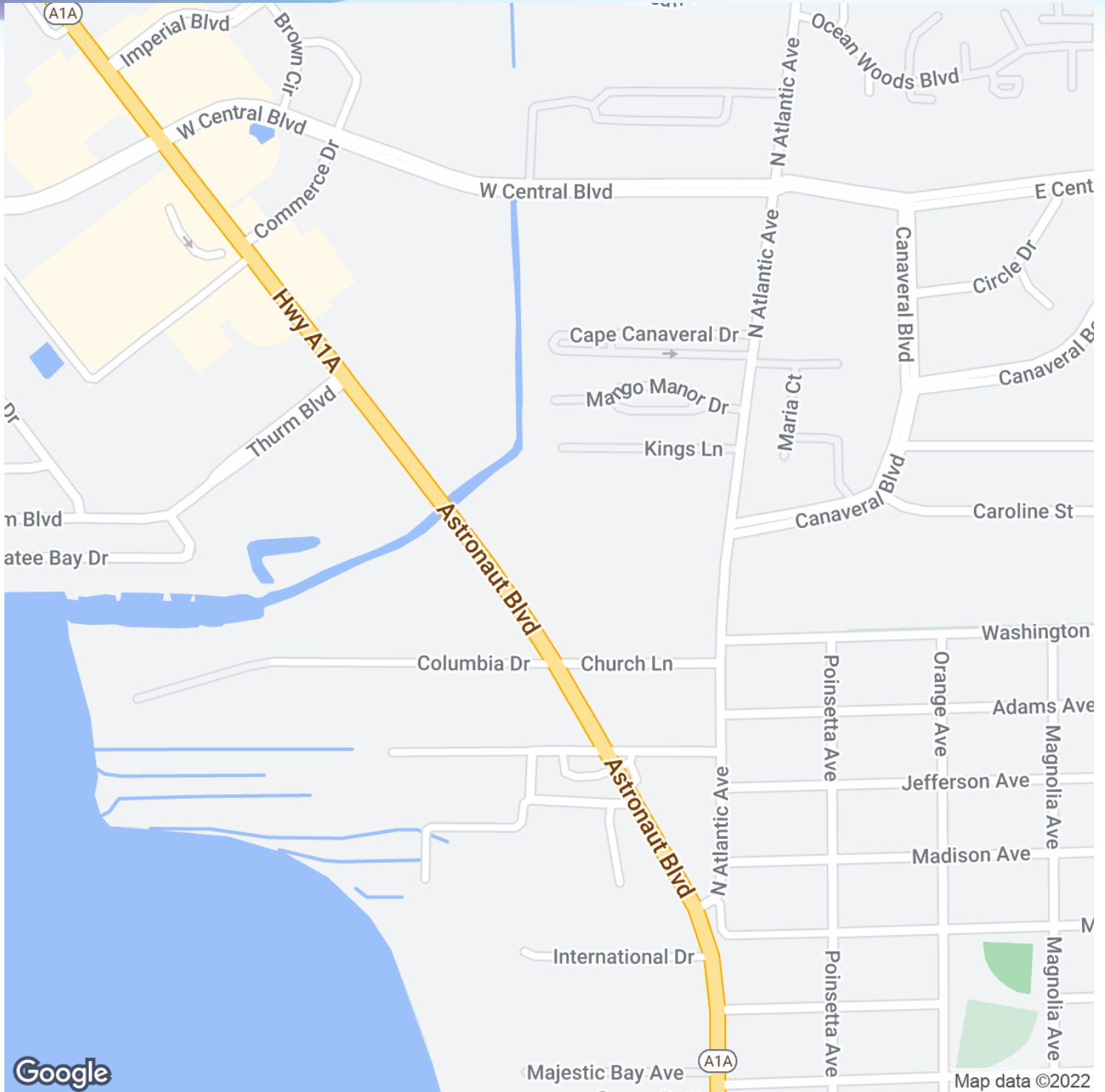

Astronaut Boulevard • Address Not Disclosed Cape Canaveral, FL



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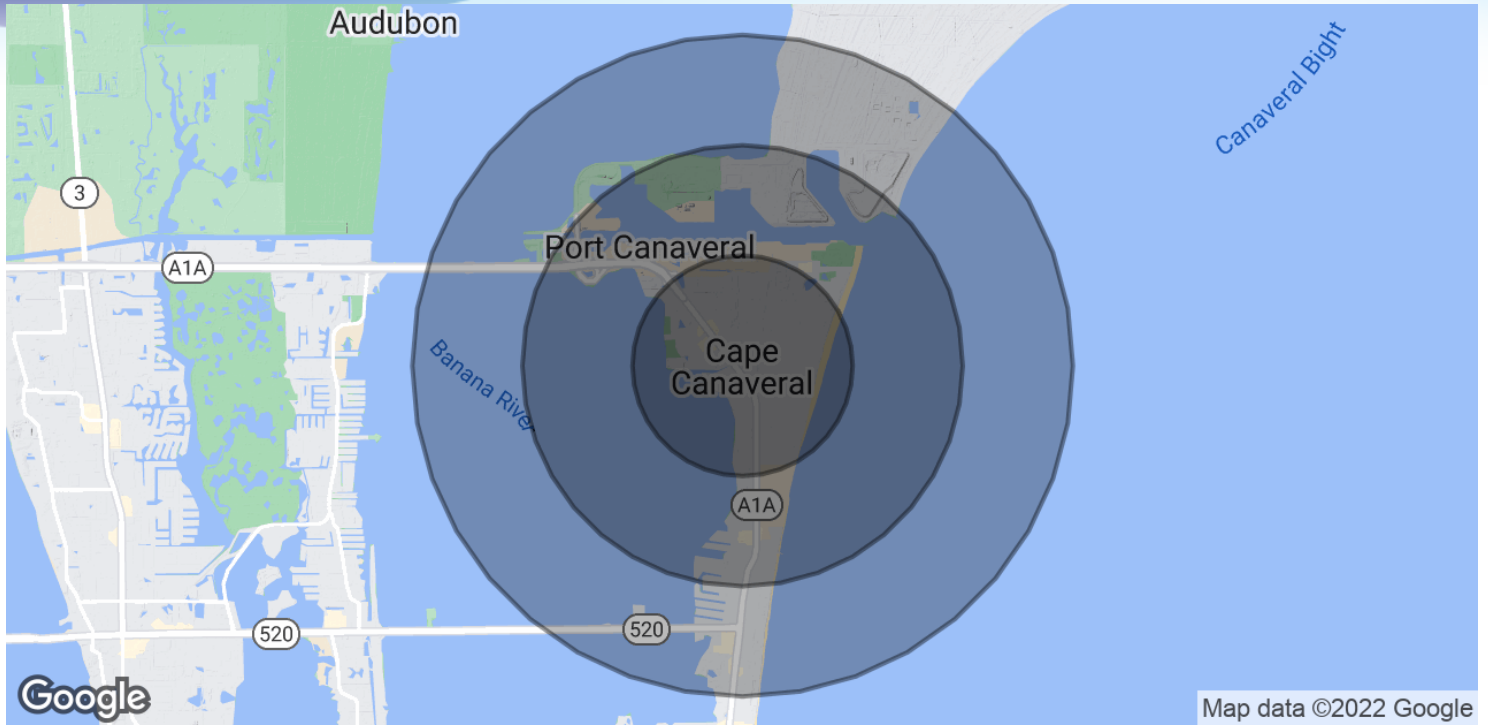

## PORT CANAVERAL CLOSES BUDGET YEAR WITH RECORD RESULTS, BOOSTED BY CRUISE COMEBACK

The final numbers are in, and Port Canaveral reported record-setting revenue for the 2021 -22 budget year that ended Sept. 30.

Revenue was \$128.06 million, which was 17.3% over what the port had been projecting before the

budget year beginning October 2021. At that time, the port expected revenue to come in at \$109.15 million.

In comparison, the port had operating revenue of \$34.55million in the 2020-21 budget year and \$67.10 million in the 2019-20 budget year.

Cruise operations were disrupted during parts of those budget years because of COVID-19.

Cruise-related revenue was particularly strong in the just-ended 2021-22 budget year, as the port recovered from a 16½-month cruise shutdown because of COVID-19 from mid-March 2020 to July 31, 2021.

The port's operating expenses for 2020-21 were \$97.26 million, leaving an operating profit of \$30.79 million.

When non-operating revenue (including federal American Rescue Plan Act funding) and capital contributions (including federal and state grants) are added to the mix, Port Canaveral had a positive change in net position of \$82.67 million. The port will use the money for upcoming capital projects.

Port Canaveral Chief Executive Officer John Murray said cruise ships based at Port Canaveral now are sailing at 100% to 135% of their double-occupancy capacity.

Disney Cruise Line is at the higher end of that range, Murray said, since many of its customers are families with younger children, and book cabins that can accommodate three or four passengers. Plus Disney has a popular new ship, the Wish, based at Port Canaveral.

In all, the port ended its budget year with \$72.86 million in cruise revenue, plus \$26.15 million in cruise-related parking revenue.

"The year ended up quite successfully, considering how we started at the tail end of the pandemic," Murray told Canaveral Port Authority commissioners at their meeting on Wednesday.



Other revenue categories included:

- Cargo, \$18.48 million.
- Leases, \$4.49 million.
- Recreation, \$4.06 million.
- Misc., \$2.01 million.

Every revenue category exceeded the budgeted amounts.

Port Canaveral Chief Financial Officer Michael Poole said the previous operating revenue record was \$106.51 million, set in fiscal 2018-19, the last previous budget year of uninterrupted cruise operations.

The \$128.06 million in operating revenue for 2021-22 is "a sizable increase" from the previous record, Poole noted. Poole said, in every month from March through September, there were more than 300,000 cruise passengers getting on or off ships at Port Canaveral.

And there were 10 consecutive weeks this summer when passenger counts topped 100,000.

### **Cargo sets record, too**

Poole said the port's cargo revenue of \$18.48 million also set a record.

Total cargo tonnage in 2021-22 was 6.57 million, which was up 26.3% from the 2020-21 budget year, when cargo tonnage was 5.20 million.

Poole said fuel, lumber and granite were among the leaders in cargo gains.

There were 553 cargo ship calls during the 2021-22 budget year, up from 489 in fiscal 2020-21.

Poole said Port Canaveral is receiving its \$72 million in federal ARPA funding over a three-year period. It received about \$15 million in the 2020-21 budget year and about \$42 million in the 2021-22 budget year. The remaining \$15 million will come in the current 2022-23 budget year that began Oct. 1.

In commenting on the financial numbers, Canaveral Port Authority Chairman Jerry Allender said: "We can say 'happy days are here again' with the money coming in."

Poole said he also is optimistic about the new budget year.

He is projecting 2022-23 revenue of \$153.96 million, 909 cruise ship calls, and 5.8 million passenger movements of people getting on or off the cruise ships.

The comparable numbers for 2021-22 were \$128.06 million in revenue, 792 cruise ship calls and 4.07 million passenger movements.

"We're very bullish" for the new budget year, Poole said.

### **New cruise ships coming**

Among the ships coming to Port Canaveral in the first

quarter of the new budget year:

**Oct. 31:** The Carnival Magic returned for the winter season. It is the fourth Carnival ship at the port.

**Nov. 6:** The Royal Caribbean Jewel of the Seas arrives for the winter season, and will be Port Canaveral's fourth Royal Caribbean ship.

**Nov. 13:** The Royal Caribbean Wonder of the Seas arrives. It will be replacing the Harmony of the Seas. The Wonder of the Seas is the largest and newest ship in the Royal Caribbean fleet. It's also the largest ship in the world today.

**Nov. 19:** The Norwegian Escape returns.

**Dec. 11:** The Norwegian Prima arrives for the winter season. The Prima is a new ship that debuted in August. Port Canaveral is the world's second-busiest cruise port, behind Miami, based on passenger counts.

Port Canaveral has five cruise brands with ships based there — Carnival, Disney, MSC, Norwegian and Royal Caribbean.

In addition, Victory Casino Cruises offers twice-daily gambling excursions from Port Canaveral from Wednesdays through Sundays.

### **Hattaway honored at final meeting**

Canaveral Port Authority Commissioner and Secretary/Treasurer Robyn Hattaway was recognized at the end of her final meeting as commissioner on Wednesday.

Hattaway, an attorney, chose not to run for reelection for a second four-term term this year. Instead, Hattaway ran in a Republican primary in Florida House District 30, but lost to Chase Tramont.

Allender lauded Hattaway for "her knowledge, her insight, the contributions that she's made to the operation of the port in general, as well as on the financial side. I wish her the best in whatever future endeavors she might decide to go to."

Port Commissioner Micah Loyd told Hattaway that "it's been a pleasure serving with you, and I'm glad that we've had this opportunity. So thank you for all your service."

Port Authority Vice Chair Kevin Markey said Hattaway "really is a committed public servant. She worked hard at her job."

"Thanks for all the hard work here," Commissioner Wayne Justice told Hattaway.

Hattaway noted in her closing remarks that her four years as a port commissioner "have been not at all what I expected," as it was punctuated by the COVID-19-related cruise industry shutdown.

"We've been through an international pandemic, and we've come out stronger and grown in the process," Hattaway said. "We've added a cruise terminal and approved an aquarium, and just amazing things have come out of this last four years. It has been an honor and a privilege."

Hattaway thanked port management, staff, port ambassadors and her fellow commissioners.

"It has been a pleasure and an honor to serve with all of you," Hattaway told the other commissioners, citing their civility and their professionalism. "So thank you for the opportunity."

Replacing Hattaway as port commissioner will be Fritz VanVolkenburgh, who will take office at the Port Authority's next meeting on Dec. 7.

VanVolkenburgh is the chief of staff for District 2 Brevard County Commission office. He previously worked as a finance manager for Brevard County, internal auditor for the Brevard County clerk of court, assistant state attorney in the 18th Judicial Circuit in Brevard County, management consultant for Deloitte Consulting and bank operations officer for Barnett Bank.

VanVolkenburgh was unopposed in the 2022 election, as were Allender and Justice. All are Republicans, as are Loyd and Markey.
