Freestanding +/- 2,235 SF warehouse located at 2807 W Gadsden Street in Pensacola, Florida. Situated on a +/- 0.15-acre parcel and zoned HC/LI, the property is well-suited for light industrial, storage, or small business operations.

The building features two drive-in bays, three interior workrooms (including one insulated space), and a small front lay-down yard. The site is fully fenced, providing secure outdoor storage and controlled access.

Positioned with convenient access to major corridors and to surrounding commercial and industrial users, this property offers a functional layout for an owner/user seeking an affordable, efficient industrial space.

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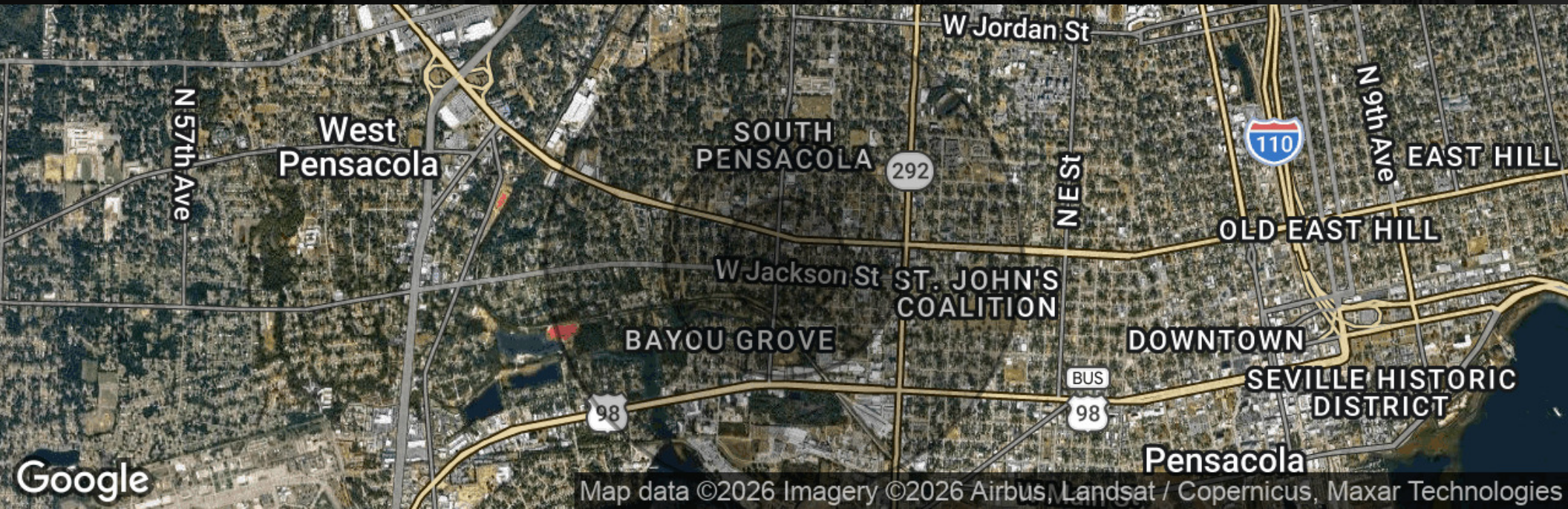


Escambia County HC/LI Zoning District

Purpose of the district: The heavy commercial and light industrial (HC/LI) district establishes appropriate areas and land use regulations for a complementary mix of industrial uses with a broad range of commercial activities. The primary intent of the district is to allow light manufacturing, large-scale wholesale and retail uses, major services, and other more intense uses than allowed in the commercial district.

Uses Permitted:

(1) Residential	Any residential uses outside of the industrial (I) future land use category, but if within the commercial (C) future land use category (and not the principal single-family dwelling on an existing lot of record), only as part of a predominantly commercial development; and excluding new or expanded manufactured (mobile) home parks & subdivisions.
(2) Retail Sales	Retail sales including medical marijuana dispensing facilities, sales of alcoholic beverages, sales of automotive fuels, and sales of new and used automobiles, motorcycles, boats, manufactured (mobile) homes.
(3) Retail Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Car washes, automatic or manual, full service or self-serve. • Child care facilities. • Hotels, motels and all other public lodging, including boarding and rooming houses. • Personal services, including those of beauty shops, health clubs, pet groomers, dry cleaners and tattoo parlors. • Professional services, including those of realtors, bankers, accountants, engineers, architects, dentists, physicians, and attorneys. • Rental of automobiles, trucks, utility trailers and recreational vehicles. • Repair services, including appliance, furniture, upholstery, jewelry, small engine, major motor vehicle/boat, but excluding outdoor work or storage. • Restaurants and brewpubs. • Taxi and limousine services.
(4) Public and Civic	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Broadcast stations with satellite dishes and antennas, including towers. • Cemeteries, including family cemeteries. • Community service facilities, including auditoriums, libraries, museums, and neighborhood centers. • Educational facilities, including preschools, K-12, colleges, and vocational schools. • Emergency service facilities, including law enforcement, firefighting, and medical assistance. • Funeral establishments. • Homeless shelters. • Hospitals. • Offices for governmental agencies or public utilities. • Places of worship. • Public utility structures, including telecommunications towers, but excluding industrial uses not otherwise permitted.
(5) Recreation & Entertainment	Commercial entertainment facilities, indoor or outdoor, including movie theatres, amusement parks, and stadiums, but excluding motorsports facilities. Commercial recreation facilities, including those for walking, hiking, bicycling, recreational vehicles, swimming, skateboarding, bowling, court games, field sports, and golf, but excluding off-highway vehicle uses and outdoor shooting ranges. Parks, with or without permanent restrooms or outdoor event lighting.
(6) Industrial	Light industrial uses, including research and development, printing and binding, distribution and wholesale warehousing, and manufacturing, all within the confines of buildings and without adverse off-site impacts. Marinas, industrial. Microbreweries, microdistilleries, and microwineries, except in areas with the zoning designation HC/LI-NA.
(7) Agricultural	Food produced primarily for personal consumption by the producer, but no farm animals. Nurseries and garden centers, including adjoining outdoor storage or display of plants. Veterinary clinics, excluding outside kennels.
(8) Other	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Billboards structures, excluding areas zoned ID-CP, GBD, or GID prior to adoption of HC/LI zoning. • Building or construction trades shops and warehouses, including on-site outside storage. • Bus leasing and rental facilities, not allowed within MU-S. • Deposit boxes for donation of used items when placed as an accessory structure on the site of a charitable organization. • Outdoor adjacent display of plants by garden shops and nurseries. • Outdoor sales. • Outdoor storage of trailered boats and operable recreational vehicles, excluding repair, overhaul or salvage activities. • Parking garages and lots, commercial, not allowed within MU-S. • Sales and outdoor display of prefabricated storage sheds.
